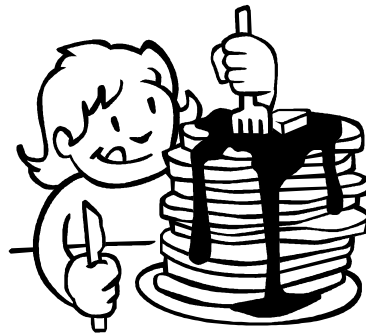

School Programs for children this year.**

The first FDS program will begin at 9:45, when children of all ages will be welcomed into a class based on the one-room school house model of teaching, where older children assist younger children, and everyone learns from each other. Led by Teacher Amy, children will participate in games, crafts, songs & activities with emphasis on practicing Quaker values (such as cooperation, respect, equality, & community).

The second FDS class will begin at 11:15. Following gathering at 10:45, children will remain for 15 minutes of silent worship, then follow their teachers to the classrooms for a 30 minute class from the FDS curriculum. **There will be no class during Meeting on Family Sundays (First Sunday)** - we hope children will remain in meeting for the entire worship (11:00-11:30).

This fall the younger class will begin with “Learning to Listen— Without and Within,” while the older class will study how Quakerism relates to other world religions.

Noreen will provide childcare throughout the morning, as usual.
